ATAG's Concerns With Section 10.4



Issue 1: The 20% tree canopy requirement for one-family development is at risk

Background:

- The current Article 5 Residential (R) Districts of the ACZO specifies requirements for one-family development (R5 – R-20).
- The new Article 10.4 Expanded Housing Option Development specifies the requirements for the new "Missing Middle" multifamily housing.

Memorandum to LRPC and ZOCO states:

"If the draft ACZO amendments for expanded housing option development are adopted, the CBPO requirement for 20% canopy for one-family development would continue to apply to one-family development because the current R district regulations in Article 5 would not change."

THIS STATEMENT NEEDS TO BE REVIEWED BY A LAND USE ATTORNEY TO ENSURE IT IS LEGAL.

The Code of Virginia 15.2-961:

- . 10% tree canopy for a residential site zoned 20 or more units per acre
- 15% tree canopy for a residential site zoned between 10-20 or more units per acre
- 20% tree canopy for a residential site zoned 10 units or less per acre

ATAG's Concerns With Section 10.4



Issue 2: The "one tree per unit" policy results in fewer trees than the current 20% minimum for single family detached.

Background:


Proposed Section 10.4.6.E - On-site Trees:


- Option 6A 10% tree canopy or 1 tree per unit, which ever is greater
- · Option 6B 10% tree canopy on all lots


Memorandum to LRPC and ZOCO states:


"Depending on the specific development proposal (e.g., number of dwellings, site area, tree species), Option 6A would <u>generally result</u> in tree canopy coverage that is <u>closer to parity</u> with the CBPO requirement for one-family development."

Issue 3: The "one tree per unit" policy may not be legal.

Code of Virginia section 15.2-961 specifically states:

"J. In no event shall any <u>local tree replacement or planting ordinance</u> adopted pursuant to this section <u>exceed the requirements set forth herein.</u>"
